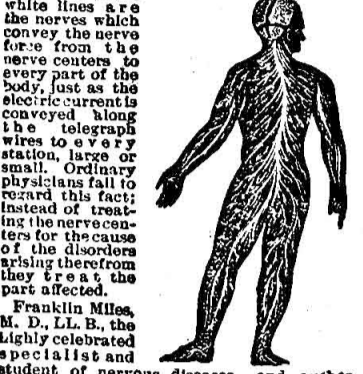

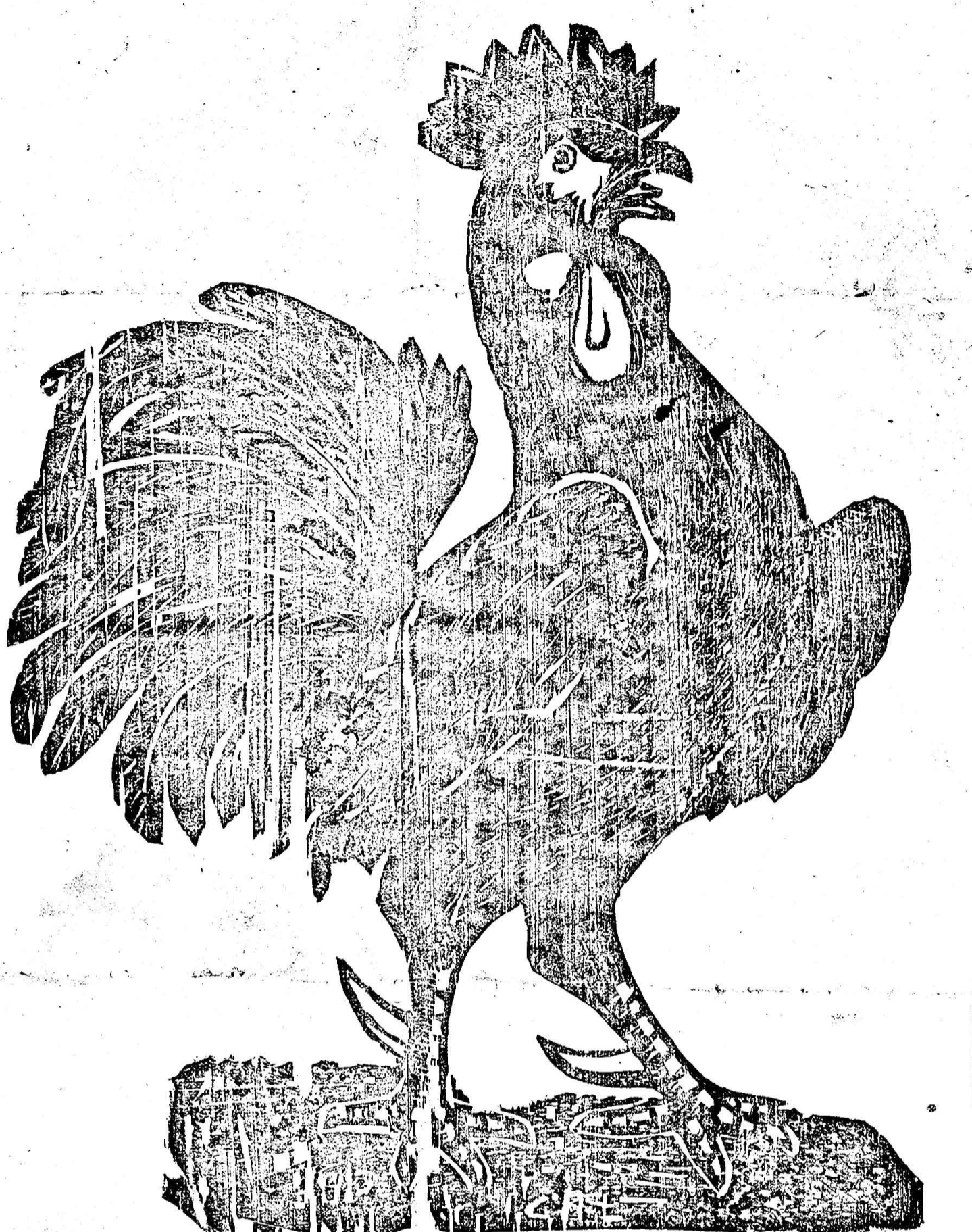

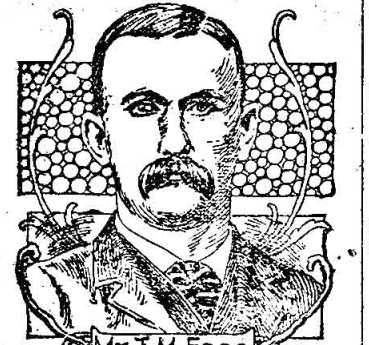

SENATE AND HOUSE.

CHAIRMAN BABCOCK'S ESTIMATES.

Washington, November 7.—At 8 o'clock tonight Mr. Babcock, chairman of the republican congressional committee, gave out the following statement:

"Returns received up to this hour show that we have elected over 230 members with several other states to bear from. We have carried the solid congressional delegation of 23 states. We have carried the majority of the delegations in 30 states, thereby enabling us to elect a president in case the election should be thrown into the house. The returns indicate that we have secured control of the next senate by a majority of one to three, without counting the vote of North Carolina, which has probably elected a republican legislature."

Chairman Babcock's figures show that the republicans have carried these states by solid congressional delegations: Connecticut, Colorado, Delaware, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, North Dakota, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, Washington, Wyoming, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

The number of districts he claims the republicans carried in other states are: Alabama, two; Arkansas, one; California, six; Illinois, twenty-one; Iowa, ten; Kentucky, five; Maryland four; Missouri, seven; New York, twenty-nine; North Carolina, three; Ohio, ten; Pennsylvania twenty-seven; South Carolina, one; Tennessee, four; Texas, three; Virginia, two.

TWO THIRDS MAJORITY IN THE HOUSE

New York, November 7.—The returns of the congressional election returns today increased the magnitude of the republican victory. Since last night the number of republican representatives increased from 220 to 230 and the democratic and populist ranks shrank correspondingly in the reports, and the latter almost wholly disappeared. The figures show that the republicans will probably have not only a majority but more than two thirds of the house.

Heavy Democratic Loss.

Richmond, Va., Nov. 7.—The latest returns indicate the following Democratic majorities:

- First district, Jones 4000; Democratic gain probably 1000. Second, Tyler 3500; Democratic loss 1500. Third, Ellett 4000; Democratic loss probably 4000. Fifth, Swanson 1500; Democratic loss about 500 to 600. Sixth, Otey about 2000; Democratic loss about 3000. Seventh, Turney 1500; Democratic loss about 7000. Eighth, Meredith 2600; Democratic loss about 4500. Ninth, nearly the full returns give Walker 1350 majority in the district. Democratic loss of 6000. Tenth, Tucker, Democrat, majority very small. It is variously placed at from 400 to 800. The Fourth district is still in doubt. Full official figures will probably be necessary to decide it.

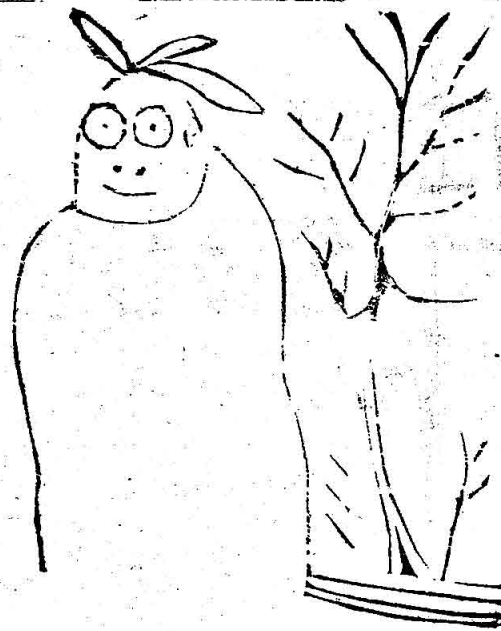

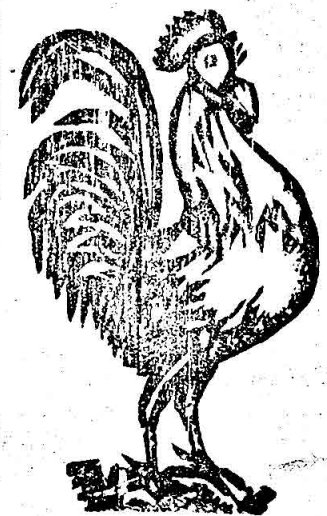
